Subject: Fish slaughter – stunning before slaughter

The Commission's inception impact assessment of the ongoing revision of the EU legislation on animal welfare suggests introducing species-specific provisions for farmed fish at the time of killing.

Recent investigations into European aquaculture¹² reveal the use of slaughter methods which have long been identified as unacceptable for fish welfare by the European Food Safety Authority³ and the World Organisation for Animal Health⁴. The investigations also demonstrate the suffering associated with time out of water and with handling practices around slaughter.

As well as introducing requirements to effectively stun fish where species-specific parameters are known, will the Commission propose that:

- 1. Best handling practices be required at slaughter for all finfish species in aquaculture?
- 2. The worst slaughter techniques (e.g. asphyxiation in air or ice, salt baths and gas saturated water) be banned for all finfish species in aquaculture?
